Too many Homeless Cats in your Neighborhood?

Feral cats are cats that weren't raised by humans or they are abandoned cats that have become wild. Taking them to a shelter doesn't solve the problem. They're not adoptable so they're killed. And more cats come to take their place.

There is a Solution: Trap Neuter Return

Cats are humanely trapped and taken to the vet to be fixed. The feral cats are ear tipped and put back out in the neighborhoods they know where they will be taken care of by volunteers. Homes are found for the kittens and adoptable adult cats through shelters or rescue organizations.

T.N.R. works: The cats stop having kittens. Over time, the number of feral cats in a neighborhood drops dramatically.
